2nd International Symposium – Rome, 3-5 April 2018

- ★ About 100 speakers and 760 participants from 350 organizations,
 72 governments and 6 United Nations agencies attended;
- + Country representatives, policy-makers, farmers and agroecology practitioners, scientists, civil society organizations, foundations and private sector representatives;
- → Interactive panels covering a range of key issues, from policy issues to innovative markets and co-creation of knowledge. Including innovation, financing and inter-agency cooperation;
- → During the last day of the Symposium, launched the Scaling up Agroecology Initiative, a forward-looking proposal for action built on the outcomes of the international and regional symposia;
- **→** This represents a 10-year multi-partner and stakeholder endeavor to harness practices, policies, knowledge and alliances on agroecology to achieve equitable and sustainable food systems.
